Directions to Norlo Park 3050 Lincoln Way E, Fayetteville, PA 17222

Norlo Park is on US-30/Lincoln Way East between Caledonia State Park and Chambersburg, PA

FROM CALEDONIA STATE PARK:

Beginning at PA-233, travel west on US-30 for about 5 miles. Turn Left onto Lincoln Terrace. Continue at ** below.

FROM CHAMBERSBURG (THE WEST AT I-81)


Beginning at I-81, travel east on US-30 for about 3.5 miles. <u>Pass</u> the silo and the large brick barn. Turn right onto Lincoln Terrace. Continue at ** below.

(Lincoln Terrace is a small road next to a white sign with green lettering for "NORLO PARK", like the picture below.)

- Continue to the stop sign on Lincoln Terrace.
- Turn right.
- Just after the tennis courts on the right, turn into a large parking lot.
- · Look for the start table near Pavilion 1.





START AREA: Pavilion at Norlo Park, 3050 Lincoln Way E, Fayetteville, PA 17222. Free parking is available.

START/FINISH TIME: 9 am – noon; finish by 3 pm.

SANCTIONED BY: This event is sanctioned by the American Volkssport Association (AVA), a member of the International Federation of Popular Sports. This event counts towards the acquisition of IVV Achievement Awards.

PROCEDURE: AVA policy requires that every participant sign the insurance waiver and obtain a numbered start card which is stamped at control points along the course. At the Finish, the validated card is turned in and IVV books are stamped for official credit, if desired. The trail may be walked a second time on the same day using the same start card at no additional cost.

ELIGIBILITY: Everyone is welcome to participate. Children 12 and under must be accompanied by an adult. Walk at your own pace.

FEES and CREDIT: This event costs \$3.00. There are no "Free Walkers". NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN. There will be no special award for this event.

<u>DISCLAIMER:</u> The American Volkssport Association or its subsidiary clubs are not responsible for theft or loss of personal belongings or property Reasonable effort will be made by the sponsors to make this a safe, enjoyable and memorable event.

<u>CONDITIONS:</u> This event will be held, regardless of weather – rain or shine! Pets must be on a leash at all times and are not permitted in any buildings. Please clean up after your pet.

FAYETTEVILLE: The little hamlet of Fayetteville was founded in 1810. It was originally called "Milton Mills" and was later renamed for General Lafayette. Fayetteville is located in eastern Franklin County, and was on the original route of the Lincoln Highway.

FAYETTEVILLE FIRE COMPANY CHICKEN DINNER: The Fayetteville Fire Company, which you will pass on the walk, will hold its monthly chicken dinner during our walk! From 11AM-2PM, you can enjoy an all-you-can-eat meal of their famous chicken, vegetables and homemade desserts for \$12.00 per person.

TRAIL DESCRIPTIONS: The trail is primarily on walking paths in Norlo Park and the road shoulders and sidewalks in residential areas and business areas around Fayetteville. Sidewalks do not all have curb cuts. The trail is suitable for strollers. Wheelchairs will have difficulty.

Norlo Park is popular for walking enthusiasts because of its sweet network of walking trails. Kids will enjoy the playgrounds before and after the walk. In the park, you will visit the 1880's Quincy Railroad Station which once serviced the town of Quincy on the Mont Alto Railroad, and later the Cumberland Valley and Pennsylvania Railroads. See the two Pennsylvania Railroad Cabooses! Your walk route will take you along the original route of the Lincoln Highway as well as very short stint along the highway's reroute as you explore the Fayetteville Antique Market. Enjoy the lovely view of South Mountain as you stroll down the historic road to Lee Way, a 19th century Victorian-style farmhouse with eerie architecture. Ponder the old home with its spooky spires and decide for yourself: Is it haunted? And what is the story of "Cap'n" John H. Buckman, the architect of this odd house? Did he really die of carbolic acid poisoning?
